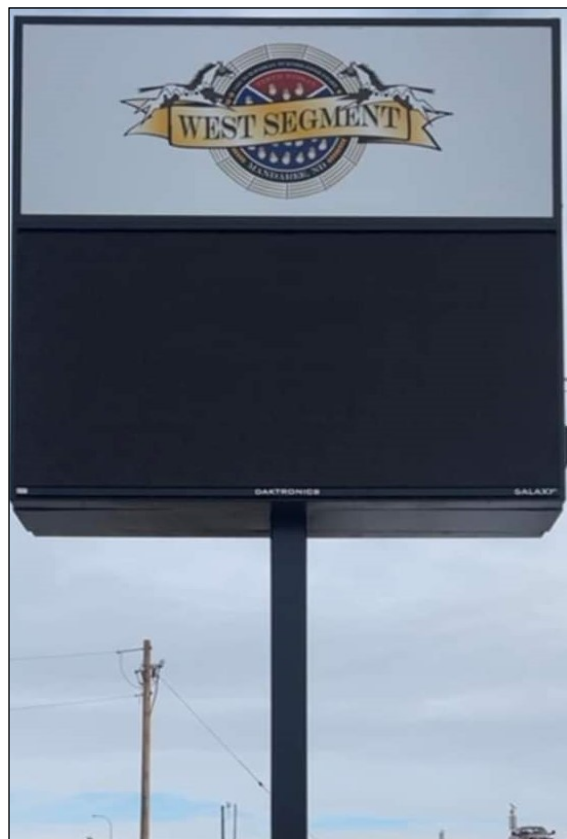


Our New Marquee Sign Serves Both the Mandaree School & The West Segment Community Members

Councilwoman Turner-Long Fight Update



I would like to extend my deepest sympathy to the family and relatives of Anthony Joseph White Bear on the loss of their beloved one. I would also like to extend my condolences to families and relatives who lost loved ones from other segments.

Here we are in the second month of the new year of 2022. Already we have had some dangerous windchills in our area this past month so I hope everyone is keeping warm. We also need to remember that COVID-19 is still here in our area we need to keep sanitizing and wearing masks whenever you go out. All employees at the Water Chief Hall are required to wear masks, we ordered KN95 face masks to wear. If you come in the hall with no masks security will provide a mask for you.

There is a lot going on with developments being in the works which won't be a reality until everything is in place. For now, I can let you know what is in the works; We are focusing on a new daycare center as soon as the water and sewage are worked on which is in the hands of rural water. The location will be where the old head start center used to be with a new building and parking lot in place. Bernadine Fredericks Mendez will be the Director for the new Daycare center.

Also with the CARE program they are working with the Good Road Recovery team in helping us get the rehabilitation in place. Right now, Tiffany Hunts Along is the point of contact person for the CARE program.

The jump house here in our community is open only to families because of COVID for birthday parties, baby showers, things like this. You need to schedule a head of time so you are put on the schedule list. The contacts are LeeAnna Nation: 421-1868 and Jordan Mann-421-9214. Please contact LeeAnna or Jordan so they can schedule you in for your family event. It will cost \$100.00 to use and a \$200.00 deposit down which will be returned to you if and only if the jump house is cleaned. If the jump house is NOT cleaned you will not get your \$200.00 back. We had no choice but do this because the jump house was already abused and we don't want this to happen again.

We hope to get the pantry up and running soon. This assisting pantry will be for those who are in need. We are asking the community for any donations you have to offer which will be greatly appreciated and placed in the assisting pantry. Community members can donate items such as; can goods, toilet paper, pampers, anything you have that others in need can use, you can donate. The contact person is Lindsey Fox Sepeta her cell is 421-6347.

We are moving along we just had the new Marquee turned on for the first time. I would like to invite all community members to feel free to use the marquee for birthday wishes, anniversaries or other announcements for everyone to read. You can also watch for updates and alerts on this new marquee sign. Your COVID Rapid testing and updates will be featured on the marquee.

Two of the West Segment Development Authority members were on hand when we turned on the marquee in our community. Arla Jean Muzzy and Franina Lincoln were with us during this time. Here are the members and their positions for the West Segment Development Authority: President-Lisa DeVille, Vice-President-Arla Jean Muzzy, Secretary- Cory Sanders, Treasurer-Adam Fredericks, Member-Franina Lincoln.

Please don't expect these developments to happen right now all this takes time. I appreciate your patience.

On another note, we had a community meeting here at the hall. Items on the agenda were the following; the day care, the jump house, care program, and our assisting pantry were all discussed. There were other updates that were given as well. Carson Hood said his main concern is allottee's rights when it comes to selling water for livestock, agriculture and irrigation. Presently, Ron Brugh is working on putting initiatives together for Councilwoman on water compacts. Frankee Hall also introduced herself in helping with the development here in Mandaree. Lila Gwin from the Hidatsa Language Program, let the people know they're working on having our signs around Mandaree changed to our Hidatsa language. Also Bernadine Fredericks Mendez gave a presentation on the day care here in Mandaree. Tia Mandan who is the TAT Fitness & Recreational Specialist gave a short update on the walk challenges she has going on for adults and the elders as well. She also asked the community for ideas on other events, they would like to see her organize. Another speaker was Tex Hall, who spoke about the latest offer from Tesoro trespassing was 25 million and he is still pushing for the first of 300 million. He also mentioned the 1887 original allotment act the tribal business council does not own our allottee land. We are the owners of our own allottee lands. He referred to the 1987 referendum 638.

needs:

Hearing Aids

Glasses, Doctor appointments and Elder ramps.

Another service West Segment provides is light housekeeping, such as; vacuuming, sweeping, mopping and errand runs.

Please keep in mind the Beautification Program is available to aid with plastic on windows, ice melt, shoveling, etc.

To qualify for these benefits, you must be of age 60 and enrolled with the tribe.

Please get all documents to me at least 7-12 days prior for scheduling. You may also call if you need to weatherize your home. Please be advised all checks will be mailed out to the vendor, and I will pick up the appointment travel checks.

Next month on March 31, 2022, an Elder Fair will be held in Parshall at the red hall. West Segment will be taking the elder bus, if you need a ride, please contact us. Plans are still in the process; I will update you later.

If you are in need of assistance, please call me or stop by the office and drink a cup of coffee and we can visit.

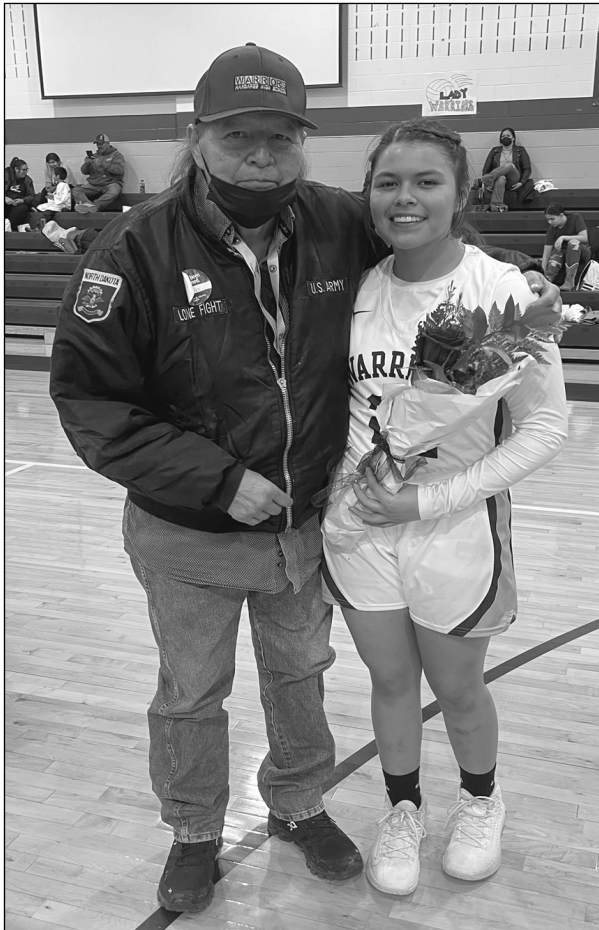

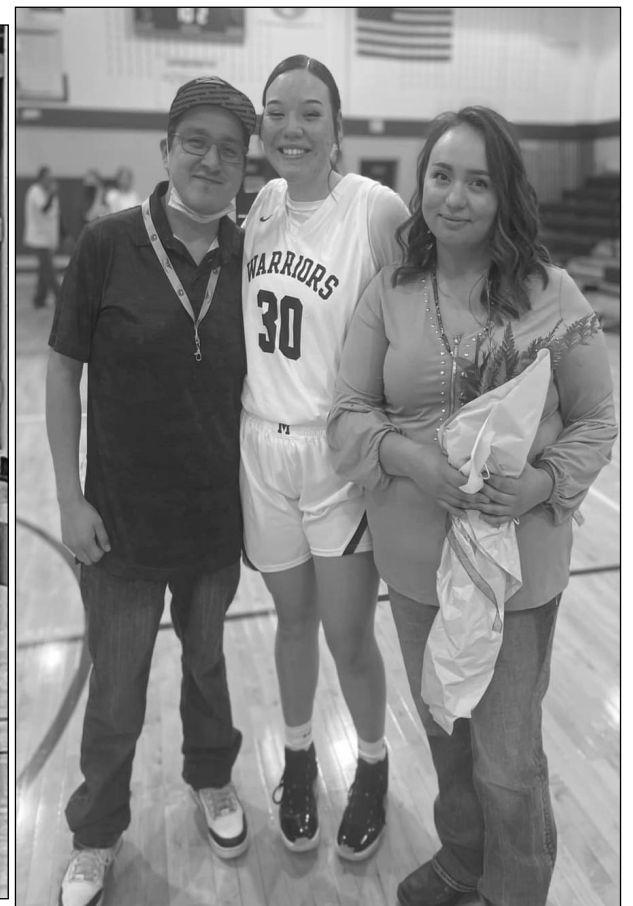

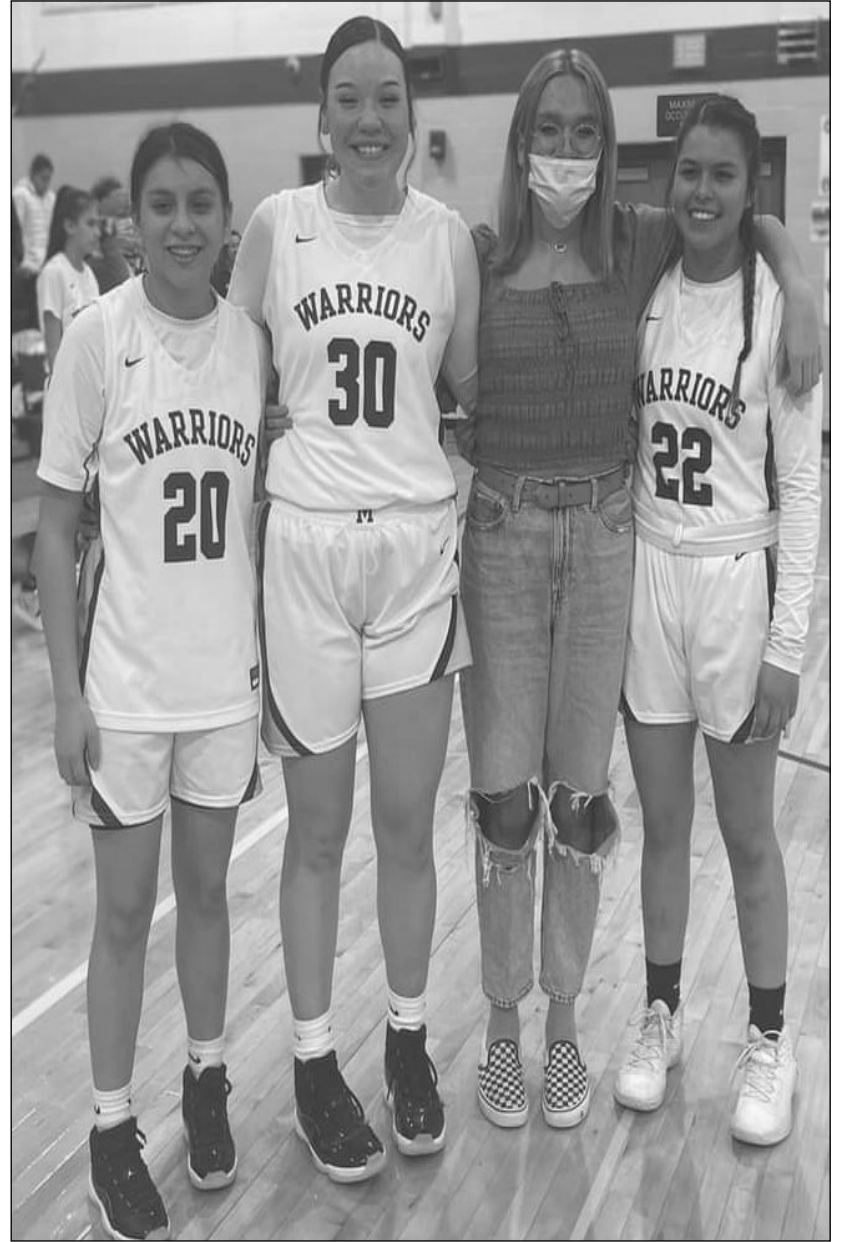

MHA Nation Tribal Health Insurance Eligibility

- **Required - Apply for another Health Insurance. If denied, provide denial letter before approval for MHA Sanford-Tribal Health Insurance Coverage.**
- **All individuals signing up for this Health Insurance must be enrolled MHA Tribal members of the Mandan, Hidatsa, Arikara Nation.**
- **If the member currently has Health insurance Coverage or able to obtain Health Insurance Coverage. They are not eligible for this plan and should stay with their current coverage:**
 - ➔ Medicare ➔ Employer Coverage
 - ➔ Medicaid ➔ Spousal Plan
 - ➔ ACA Market Place - American Rescue Plan

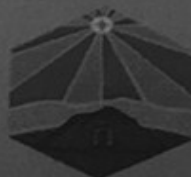
Tribal Health Insurance was originally created to help MHA Members get from one point of coverage to the other; without experiencing gaps in their coverage.

- **If an MHA Member is paying out of pocket for their MHA enrolled dependents. They should consult with the Tribal Health Insurance-Benefits Specialists to assist in enrolling into Health Coverage before resorting to the MHA Sanford-Tribal Health Insurance Coverage.**
- **Dual coverage is only allowed for Transplant & Cancer patients.**

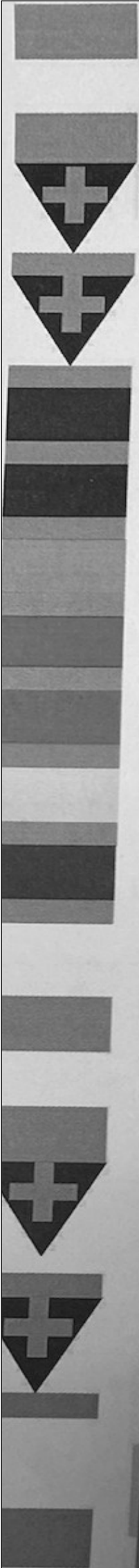

PUBLIC HEALTH NOTICE

Issued Friday, January 21, 2022

The Ft. Berthold Reservation is currently experiencing a **CRITICAL INCREASE** in COVID-19 cases.

The weekly EOC/Covid-19 Task Force Thursday Rapid Testing Event held in New Town yesterday yielded 35 Active Positives out of 203 submitted test samples. This resulted in a new positivity rate record of 17.24%.

This is the highest positivity rate seen since the start of the Pandemic in March 2020.

At this present time, a total of 231 Active Positive Cases are reported on the Ft. Berthold Reservation. This is also a new record on FBIR for active positive cases since the start of the Pandemic in March 2020.

- Parshall: 41
- Mandaree: 16
- Twin Buttes/Halliday: 9
- White Shield/Roseglen: 5
- Other: 32

Age Population Groups:

- >1 Year Old: 8
- 1-17 Years Old: 80
- 18-59 Years Old: 130
- 60 Years and Older: 13

This illustrates that Covid-19 is still a very present threat to the health and safety of the public, especially our Elders, youth, and those who are immune-compromised. It is strongly recommended everyone eligible for the vaccine to get these Covid-19 immunization doses with the booster dose. In addition, everyone is encouraged to get Covid-19 rapid tested weekly even after being vaccinated.

While it is rare, fully vaccinated individuals can still be carriers of the virus and spread it to others. This is why regular rapid testing is recommended.

Rest assured, the Covid-19 Task Force, EOC, and EMHC are diligently working to continue to provide emergency aid services to those affected. We are seeing a substantial increase in requests for these services over the past 30 days. Our Distribution Aid Center (DAC) and Isolation Care Center (ICC) teams are hard at work continuing to meet those needs of assistance.

Please remember, fully vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals should continue to take precautions by continuing to wear a well-fitted face mask, practicing frequent hand washing/hand sanitizing, and also disinfecting work and living areas frequently.

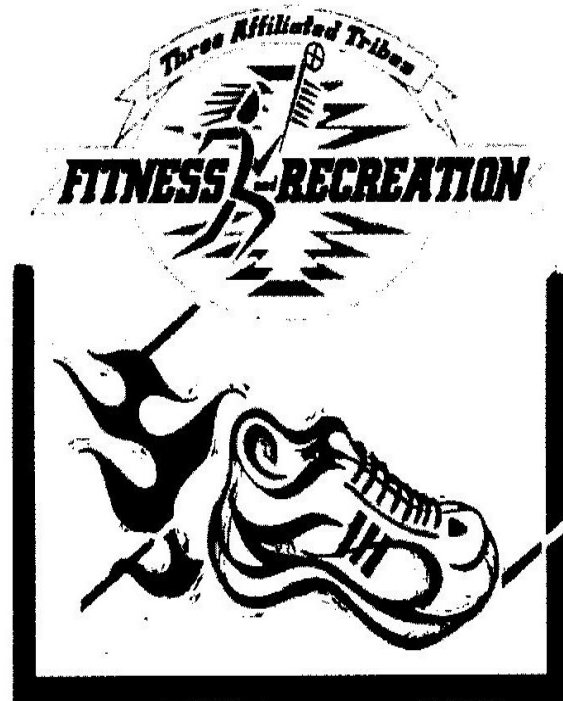

Stroke is a disease that affects the arteries leading to and within the brain. It is the No. 5 cause of death and a leading cause of disability in the United States. A stroke occurs when a blood vessel that carries oxygen and nutrients to the brain is either blocked by a clot or bursts or ruptures. When that happens part of the brain cannot get the blood (and oxygen) it needs, so it and brain cells die. 80% of strokes are preventable. What are the types of stroke?

Stroke can be caused either by a clot obstructing the flow of blood to the brain (called an ischemic stroke) or by a blood vessel rupturing and preventing blood flow to the brain (called a hemorrhagic stroke) A TIA (transient ischemic attack), or “mini stroke”, is caused by a temporary clot.

What are the effects of Stroke?

The brain is an extreme complex organ that controls various body functions. If a stroke occurs and blood flow can't reach the region that controls a particular body function, that part of the body won't work as it should.

Stroke Symptoms

By learning and sharing the F.A.S.T. warning signs, you just might save a life from stroke.

Call 911 if these signs are present

F.A.S.T. Warning Signs


Use the letters in F.A.S.T to spot a Stroke

- **F = Face Drooping** – Does one side of the face droop or is it numb? Ask the person to smile. Is the person's smile uneven?
- **A = Arm Weakness** – Is one arm weak or numb? Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?
- **S = Speech Difficulty** – Is speech slurred?
- **T = Time to call 911**

Other Stroke Symptoms

Watch for Sudden:

- **NUMBNESS** or weakness of face, arm, or leg, especially on one side of the body
- **CONFUSION**, trouble speaking or understanding speech
- **TROUBLE SEEING** in one or both eyes
- **TROUBLE WALKING**, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination
- **SEVERE HEADACHE** with no known cause

Obituary

Anthony Joseph White Bear Sr., of Mandan, ND started his journey on January 12, 2022 at a hospital in Bismarck, ND. He was born in Watford City on October 28, 1967 to the late Alton White Bear and the late Garcia (Hale) White Bear. He carried the Mandan name "White Coyote" which was given to him by the late Edwin Bensen M.D., by the request of his late grandmother Martha (Lone Fight) Hale. He was know to many as "Tony Joe". Through his late mother Garcia, he was a member of the Low Cap Clan, his father did not have a clan, so they went through his late grandfather Anthony Hale Sr., who was a member of the Water Buster Clan.

He lived in Indepence until 1972 where he then moved to Mandaree and attended elementary school. In high school, Tony Joe displayed his all-star athleticism through basketball, football, track and field (specifically shot-put and disc). He had many accolades in sports and his academics which earned him a scholarship to play football for the University of North Dakota's football team, formally known as the "Fighting Sioux". Due to a NCAA policy he was not allowed to play his first year as a freshman. Therefore, he transferred to Mayville College in Mayville, North Dakota. Due to an injury, he was seen by a specialist who then diagnosed him with kidney disease. Unfortunately, this diagnosis stopped his dream of becoming a professional NFL player.

Tony Joe attended welders training at the East Grand Forks technical school, where he achieved his welders certificate. He then went to work for the oil pipelines which transported crude oil from North Dakota to Wyoming. Since he could no longer work in the oilfield because of his kidney disease, he chose to work a more leisurely job, providing security at the Four Bears Casino. From there, he went to further his education at the University of North Dakota, in Grand Forks. In 1997, a terrible flood caused him to pack his car in the middle of the night and relocated to Bismarck. He relocated there to be closer to the medical facilities, he became a member of the kidney transplant team at Med-Center One. His first kidney came from his beloved sister Constance, unfortunately, his body rejected the kidney so he went back on the transplant list and resumed dialysis. His second transplant was from a high school football player, which was successful for the 20 years. During these years, he met his late wife Hope, and together they had two miracle babies, Arianna Constance Marie and Anthony Joseph Jr.

His interests were all encompassing, and he had a deep appreciation for learning knowledge and the arts.
