

This is the first MHA Nation's Culture & Language Division (CLD) Newsletter. We're excited to share with you an update on our activities and goals projects. To the left is the CLD organizational chart

Background: In 2017, the MHA Nation's Education Committee gave the Tribal Education Department the directive to develop and manage a New Culture & Language Division.

In April 2018, the budget for the CLD was approved. In May the first administrative staff began to be hired, and by the end of July the first Mentor-Apprentice cohort began to be hired.

- ■Staff: Continued hiring of administrative staff and Mentor-Apprentice staff.
- ■Culture & Language Survey: Development and distribution of a comprehensive survey to assess the vibrancy and statuses of the Nu'eta, Hidatsa, and Sahnish languages. This survey has been included with the mail-out of this Newsletter.

Community Events Bring Language Advocates, Tribal Elders, and Leaders Together

"Help us grow the next generation of fluent speakers," was the message attached to terracotta pots of delicate succulent plants. This message is at the heart of a series of meetings between the staff of the Culture & Language Division (CLD) of the Tribal Education Department and MHA Nation community members and elders. About 70 attended these three meetings held in August and September

In these meetings, Young Wolf introduced a few of the plans for language preservation and revitalization projects and collaborations. Among these are the Mentor and Apprentice program, that has four apprentices and 2 mentors for each of the Nu'eta, Hidatsa, and Sahnish languages. These apprentice cohorts are working to become fluent and be our next language and culture teachers

Currently, there are two Sahnish (Arikara) Apprentices (Judith Danks and Thomas Plenty Chief, Jr.) and two Hidatsa Apprentices (Mary Baker and Jayli Fimbres), as well as the Sahnish (Arikara) Coordinator (Margaret Landin). Young Wolf is looking forward to when the program is fully staffed and encouraged those interested to apply with the MHA Nation Human Resources Department.

MHA Nation chairman Mark Fox, who attended the August 28th Community Dinner event, expressed his support for the Culture & Language Division's effort and hopes that in his lifetime all the MHA Nation's languages will once again become "prevalent" on the reservation and that he'll hear it from the halls of the tribal office to any convenience store.

Tom Abe, tribal elder said, "we should all be speaking our native languages," and hoped that there could be more ways to use the language in day-to-day to living.

- ■Status of the Nu'eta, Hidatsa, and Sahnish Languages' Report: Begin research on all Nu'eta, Hidatsa, and Sahnish resources, projects, programs, and persons involved in language revitalization & preservation work. These resources will be organized in a Contact Directory and Culture & Language Resource Database.
 - *This research is integral to understanding the resources available to support future language revitalization and preservation projects, grant writing, and making educated statements and decisions regarding the status and resources for our cultures and languages.
- ■Grant Planning: Begin research on potential grants and possible collaborators for grants regarding the preservation and revitalization of our languages.
- ■Education Collaborations: Meet with the educational entities on the Fort Berthold Reservation to ensure collaborative projects and pathways of support are developed.
- ■Developing a 5 year Language Revitalization and Preservation Strategic Plan.
- ■Launching the Culture & Language Division website.
