MHA Nation Arizona Satellite Office Newsletter Extreme Heat Warning

Greetings MHA Nation! As the extreme heat continues for Arizonans, make sure to stay hydrated, taking water breaks often, being mindful of prolonged exposure to the sun. The kids are having to drink twice the amount of water than normal to stay hydrated, wearing hats and long sleaves to keep from sun exposure during school times.

On August 11, 2023 Governor Katie Hobbs declared a Sate of Emergency to support local heat relief efforts. If you or anyone you know is struggling with paying their utility

bills and for those low income households you can apply for the LIHEAP program for assistance. LIHEAP is a federally funded program that helps low income households pay their heating/ cooling bills, minimize crises, and make energy costs more affordable through <u>weatherization assistance</u> (insulation installation, window shading, HVAC service, etc.). Eligible households may receive up to \$1,200 once per year. Additionally, applicants may receive up to \$1,000 in supplemental benefits in applicable crisis situations.

The Title VI and JOM program through the schools Indigenous education program provides resources for school supplies, backpacks, and graduation gowns and caps. MHA EDUCATION GRANT SUMMARY OF SERVICES

PreK-12

The MHA Education Grant for PreK-12 was created to provide financial support for MHA enrolled members seeking education opportunities at private/charter schools, learning centers, close-up group trips, and mileage assistance.

Dual Credit

The MHA Education Grant for dual credit was created to provide financial support for MHA enrolled members seeking Higher Education by supporting them in attaining dual credit opportunities while still attending High School.

College & Beyond

The MHA Education Grant for college and beyond was created to provide financial support for MHA enrolled members seeking higher education by supporting them in attaining undergraduate, graduate, and professional degrees, as well as internships and study abroad opportunities.

Old Bill

Old Bill: Eligible Stop-out students who have not attended school for one (1) semester/quarter and are not able to gain admission or register due to an outstanding bill may receive a **one-time grant up to \$4,500** to pay outstanding debt.

Internships


Internships: Eligible full-time students may receive a **one-time grant up to \$4,500** to assist with expenses related to internships. Award amounts are based on financial need.

The Supplemental Grant is for Graduate Students in the areas of Medicine, Physical Science, Engineering, and Law School.

The Construction of the new MHA Nation tribal administration building has been completed and is now scheduled for a grand opening August 31, 2023. The new tribal headquarters is a total of 47,000 square ft. building, that will include a support wing for the BIA Fort Berthold Agency. The new tribal administration building will serve as the capitol building for our respected MHA Nation. The new headquarters replaces the old building that was built in the early 1970s and is designed with cultural significance of the MHA Nation, using our own tribal designers and artists. The new building project manager is Cheryl Bruce and the contractors are Scull Construction Services, Inc. You're welcome to tour the new headquarters with a ribbon cutting ceremony on August 31, 2023.






