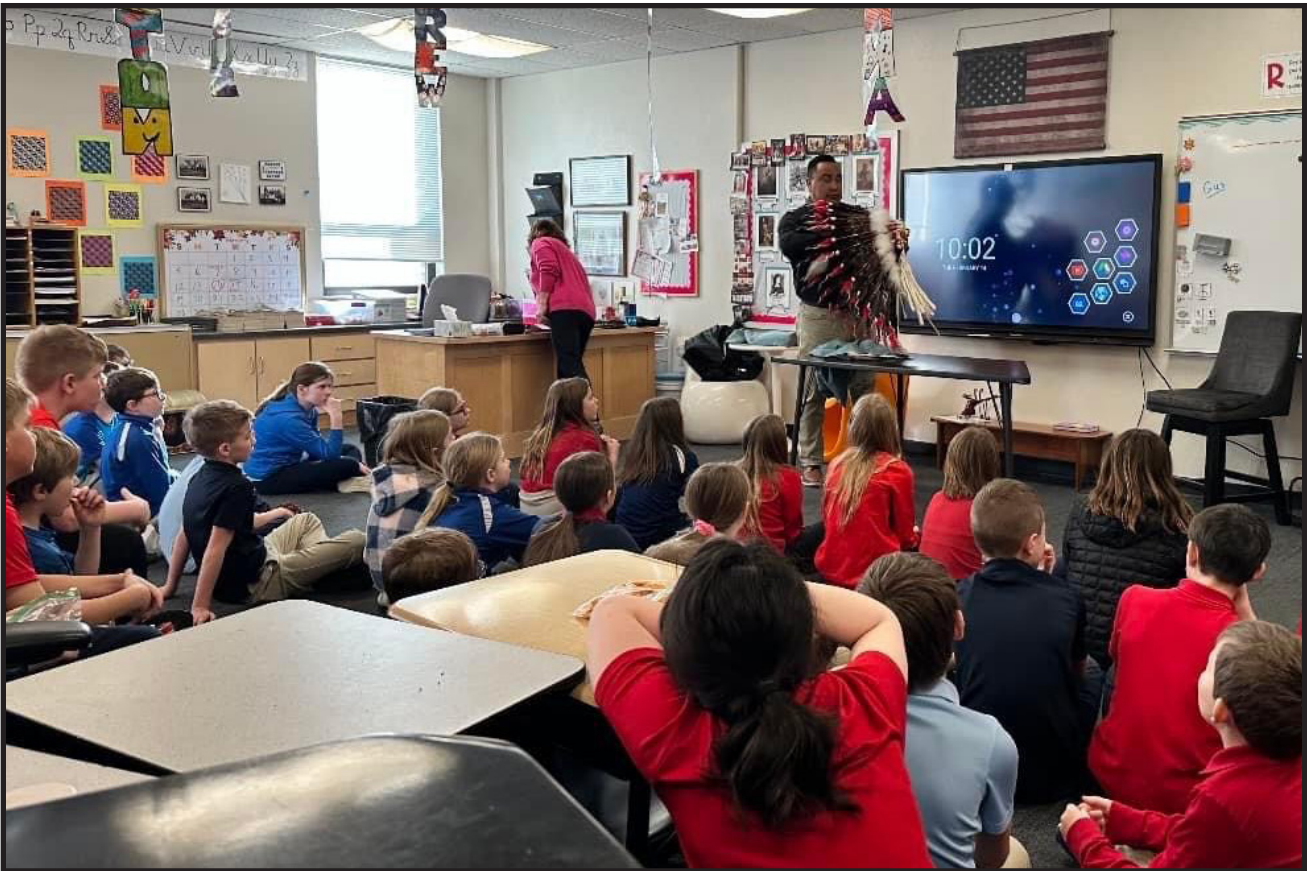
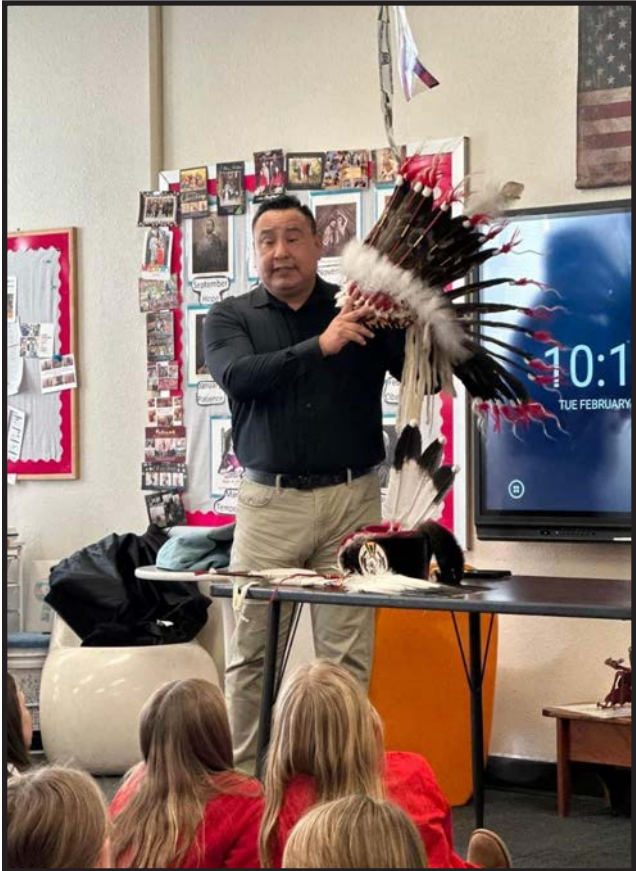

## RESTAURANT

The much anticipated White Shield Family Restaurant will provide local, casual dining to the White Shield community. The building will be approximately 5,000 sq. ft. The main dining and kitchen area will be 3,300 sq. ft. with an adjacent storage area of 1,700 sq. ft. Included in the layout is a private room for smaller, more intimate gatherings.



## TWIN HOMES

Construction of the first three, of 15 total planned, twin homes is scheduled to begin in May 2023. The individual twin homes will be approximately 2,600 sq. ft. The floor plan includes three bedrooms and two baths, with contemporary finishes.

### Seasonal Affective Disorder

Some people experience a serious mood change during the winter months, when there is less natural sunlight. This condition is called seasonal affective disorder, or SAD. SAD is a type of depression. It usually lifts during spring and summer.

**Symptoms**

Not everyone with SAD has the same symptoms. They include

- Sad, anxious, or "empty" feelings
- Feelings of hopelessness and/or pessimism
- Feelings of guilt, worthlessness or helplessness
- Irritability, restlessness
- Loss of interest or pleasure in activities you used to enjoy
- Fatigue and decreased energy
- Difficulty concentrating, remembering details and making decisions
- Difficulty sleeping or oversleeping
- Changes in weight
- Thoughts of death or suicide

SAD may be effectively treated with light therapy. But nearly half of people with SAD do not respond to light therapy alone. Antidepressant medicines and talk therapy can reduce SAD symptoms, either alone or combined with light therapy. Find additional resources for yourself or someone you care about. Get Immediate Help

People often don't get the mental health services they need because they don't know where to start. Talk to your primary care doctor or another health professional about mental health problems. Ask them to connect you with the right mental health services.

If you do not have a health professional who is able to assist you, use these resources to find help for yourself, your friends, your family, or your students. Emergency Medical Services, 911

If the situation is potentially life-threatening, get immediate emergency assistance by calling 911, available 24 hours a day.

# Recipe Corner

## Slow Cooker Taco Soup

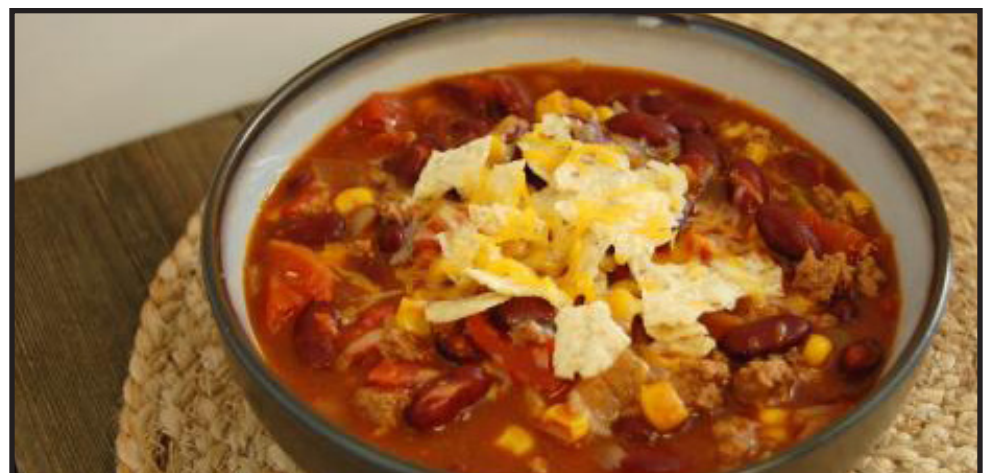
*This healthy recipe comes from NDSU Extension.*

### INGREDIENTS

- 1 lb. lean or extra-lean ground beef
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 (16-oz.) can chili beans, with liquid
- 1 (15-oz.) can kidney beans, with liquid
- 1 (15-oz.) can whole-kernel corn, with liquid
- 1 (8-oz.) can tomato sauce (low-sodium)
- 2 c. water
- 2 (14.5-oz.) cans peeled and diced tomatoes (low-sodium)
- 1 (4-oz.) can diced green chili peppers
- 1 pkg. taco seasoning mix (low-sodium)

### DIRECTIONS

In a medium skillet, cook the ground beef until browned over medium heat. Drain. Place the ground beef, onion, chili beans, kidney beans, corn, tomato sauce, water, diced tomatoes, green chili peppers and taco seasoning mix in a slow cooker. Mix to blend and cook on low setting for eight hours.

MANDAREE — Securing the number one seed, the White Shield warriors will have a bye before competing in the District 15 Boys Basketball Tournament this Saturday.

The boys from White Shield are slated to take on the winner of Game 1, which pits the Williston Trinity Crusaders against the Alexander Comets, in Game 5 of the tournament, which will be held at 5:30 p.m. at Mandaree High School.

Over the past month, the Warriors played and defeated both teams.



## Warriors take down New Town

NEW TOWN – White Shield’s boys basketball program participated in only one contest this week, but they made sure fans got their money’s worth.

Feb. 9 the team traveled to New Town and defeated the Eagles 79-49. This game was all Warriors from the get go as White Shield’s group jumped out to an 18-8 lead following the first period.

“We came out strong defensively and attacked the basket well,” Warriors Head Coach Shaun Knife said.

Knife’s group didn’t slow down in quarter two adding 19 more points to their total and increasing their lead to 15.

Following the break the Warriors got right back to business scoring 21 more points in the third alone,

effectively sealing the game a full quarter early.

Period four drew to a close and White Shield’s group walked off the court easy victors 74-49.

While the win was impressive in its own right, standout senior Jase Dickens made history in the event. Dickens scored 34 total points in the event and one of his three three-point shots in the game pushed his career total over 1,000.

“What a milestone to accomplish,” Coach Knife said. “He worked hard on his strength and shooting a lot this summer and I’m glad it’s paid off for him.”

Knife went on to praise Dickens’ growth as a leader throughout this season, “He’s grown into a really great kid, player and student athlete and I’m grateful to be able to coach a Jase Dickens.”

Dickens has been the offensive leader for White Shield in nearly every one of the Warriors games this year, consistently putting his team in position to walk away from contests victorious.

With this contest wrapped up and behind them the Warriors have officially finished up their schedule of in-district games and will enter the postseason as the top ranked team in District 15 with their 3-0 record in district play.

“We had a goal in mind at the beginning of this season,” Coach Knife said. “To be the number one seeded team in our district entering postseason play.”

White Shield’s team accomplished their preseason goal, now their attention can shift to a deep postseason run at Districts.

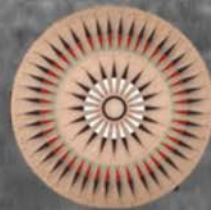

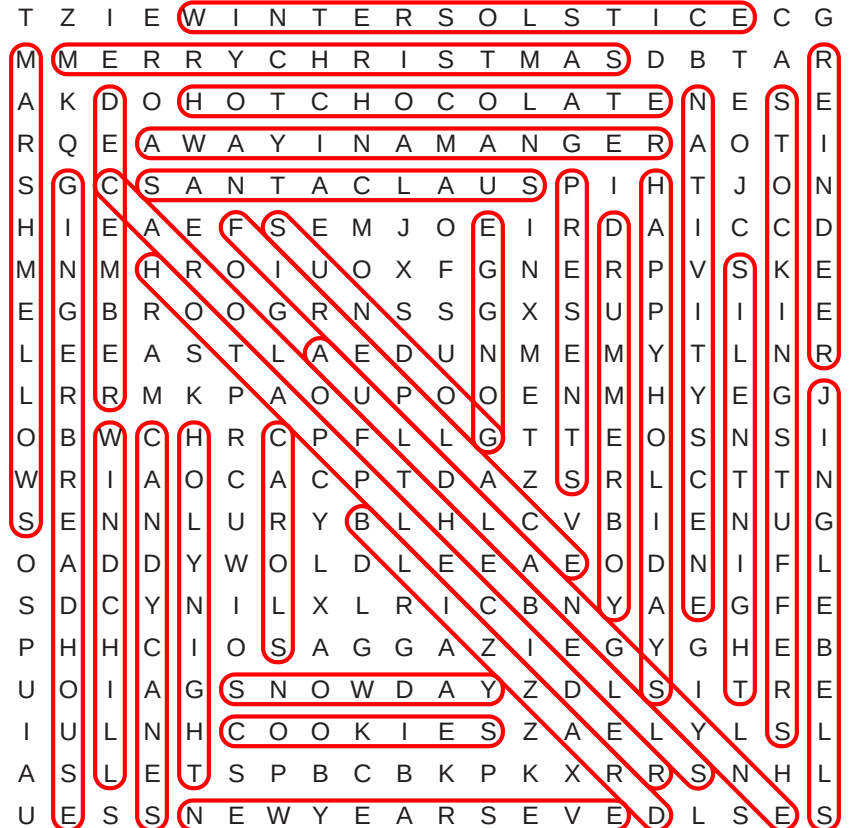

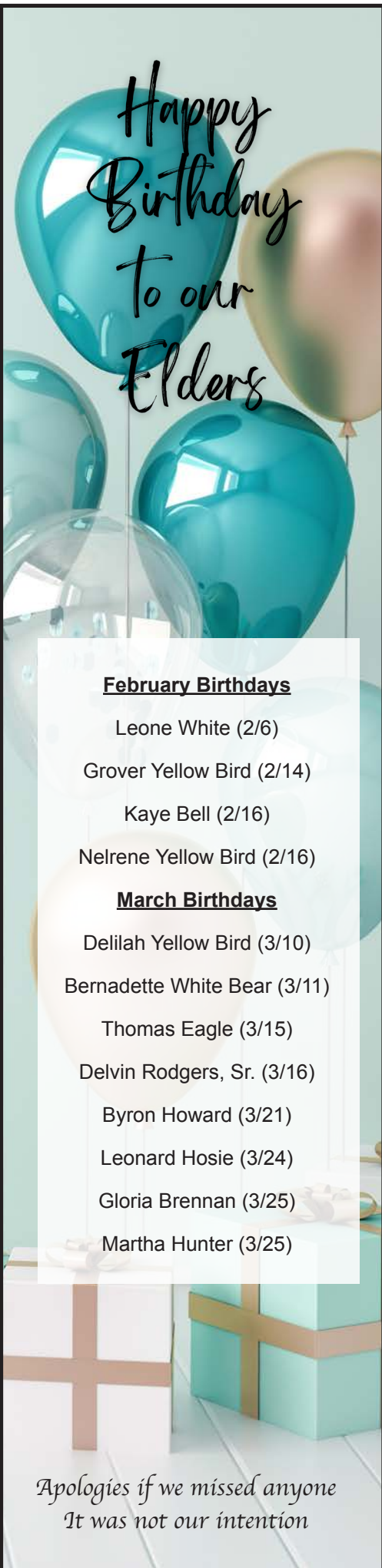
