Hello Community Members, Friends and Relatives:

I would like to send my condolences out to the families that have lost loved ones recently. Also, to those who have family members in the hospital. We pray for the families and loved ones for healing.

We continually lose a lot of Tribal members and family members to drug overdoses throughout the Reservation. There are at least 1 or 2 funerals every month pertaining to drugs and alcohol. This is becoming normal, and we need to turn this around, it's a tough addiction and we need to continue to support our Tribal Members that are in sober living. In White Shield, we have developed a Sober Living for the Ladies, and we are currently in construction for the Men's Sober Living as well.

We had a great turnout for the Easter Dinner, the community center was filled with a lot of families, and we had some great food. It's always good to see all the families at the Holiday events we have in the community. There were some great prizes, and everyone received a ham and

gift card for the Easter Holiday. Thank you to all the staff that helped plan and worked at the Easter Community Event. Without you, we wouldn't be able to have events like this.

We're getting to the end of the school year with almost a month left of school and we have the school prom approaching on April 19th and the High School and 8th Grade graduation on May 26th. The students had a great year with academics and athletic activities, with the highlight of the year being the Host of the Boys District Basketball tournament in White Shield. We had teams from New Salem, Wilton, McLean Central, Washburn, Garrison and Mandaree. Everyone pulled together as usual, and everything was a success. We had a lot of great comments from all the schools on hospitality and especially the development of the Community of White Shield.

This past month we had a meeting with all Ree Lodge Tenants, on the new policy development for all Ree Lodge rental units. We have 110 rental units in White Shield that Ree Lodge manages. It may seem a lot, but we will be looking at an additional 50 more within the next year, they will be with apartments, homes, or duplexes. We are very proud of the development of homes for the community, and it's taken over 10 years to plan and develop the housing in White Shield. We will continue to develop and make improvements to our housing in the community, and I would like to thank the Ree Lodge Management and Board for its work for our members.

We have a lot of good development in White Shield, and it's taken some time, but everything is coming along very well. The newest completed building is the Veteran Building. The Grand

Opening will be this spring and we will have the dates out soon. If you haven't been able to look around inside, make sure and stop in. Bernadette has been working hard on getting everything organized and making sure it will be ready for the Post and Auxiliary.

The Restaurant is coming along nicely, and Woodstone Construction is looking to have it completed by the beginning of this June. We're hoping to have it up and running before White Shield Pow-wow.

The Boys and Girls Club and Daycare is taking the place of the old clinic and old elders building. The building is being remodeled inside and out; the flooring was taken out because the last floor was damaged and cracked by a leak in the waterline that has been there since the building was first constructed in the 90's. We have some design drawings in the newsletter so you can see what it will look like.

Son of Star Casino Under Construction

MHA Nation along with 4 Bears Casino, DSGW Architecture and Woodstone Builders announce construction has commenced on the Son of Star Casino in White Shield, North Dakota.

The 37,000 sq. ft. casino will feature 230 slot machines, six table games, sports book, and poker room. The casino offers a variety of activities beyond gaming such as a restaurant, entertainment area, gift shop, coffee shop and a twenty-unit RV Park.

The casino design reflects the culture and heritage of the White Shield East Segment Arikara Nation. Local artists will showcase their talent through captivating murals, graphics, sculptures, and artwork adorning both the interior and exterior of the building. Visitors can explore a continuous path through the circular interior, with the heart of the action being the central gaming floor. The interior design incorporates the four fundamental elements: earth, fire, air, and water. Each section is uniquely represented through color schemes,

textures, and shapes, creating a distinct atmosphere.

This highly anticipated casino is on track for completion in spring 2025, with a grand opening planned for early summer. This exciting project will be a boon for the community, creating jobs and generating millions of dollars in revenue for the MHA Nation. The casino is also expected to attract tourists from all over the country, bringing a welcome boost to the local economy.

“We are excited to open this new casino and to share our culture with visitors from all over the country,” said MHA Nation Council Man, Fred Fox. “The casino is a symbol of our sovereignty and our economic progress.”

Future phases include an addition that accommodates expansion to the gaming floor, an 80-room hotel and an event center. Additional future phases include amenities such as a golf course, golf club house, convenience store, and truck parking.

Remarkable Women: Joelle Bearstail: A champion for Native American youth

BISMARCK, N.D. (KXNET) — Throughout the month of March, we're putting the spotlight on remarkable women in our community.

On Tuesday, we're focusing on Joelle Bearstail — a woman who's helping restore and strengthen community for Native American youth.

"Of course, I don't feel like a remarkable woman," she laughed. "I feel like I'm out of my league."

Bearstail says she comes from a long line of remarkable women.

A teacher by trade, she is no longer in the classroom — but continues to use her degree in a different way while acting as the education liaison for the MHA Nation.

While in this position, she was inspired to create a non-profit called ImagiNative: an idea which, she claims, was hugely influenced by her own experiences.

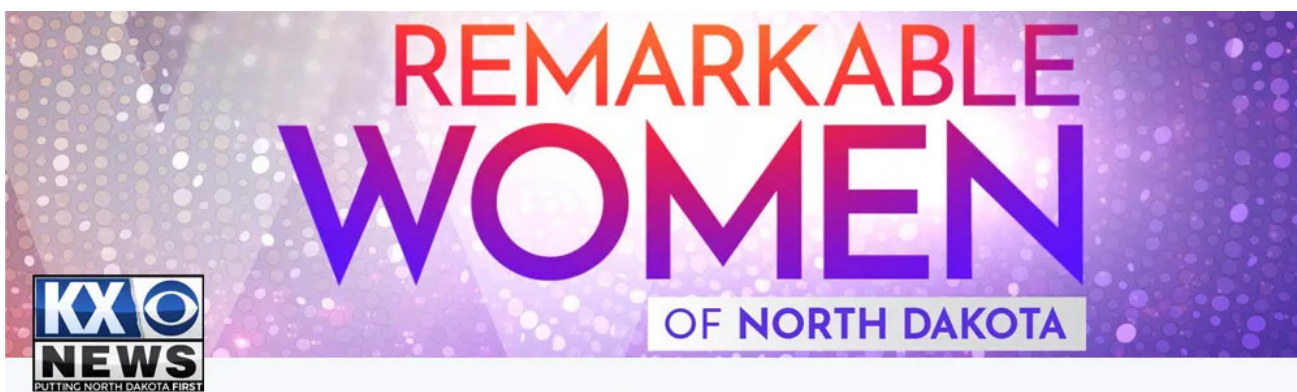
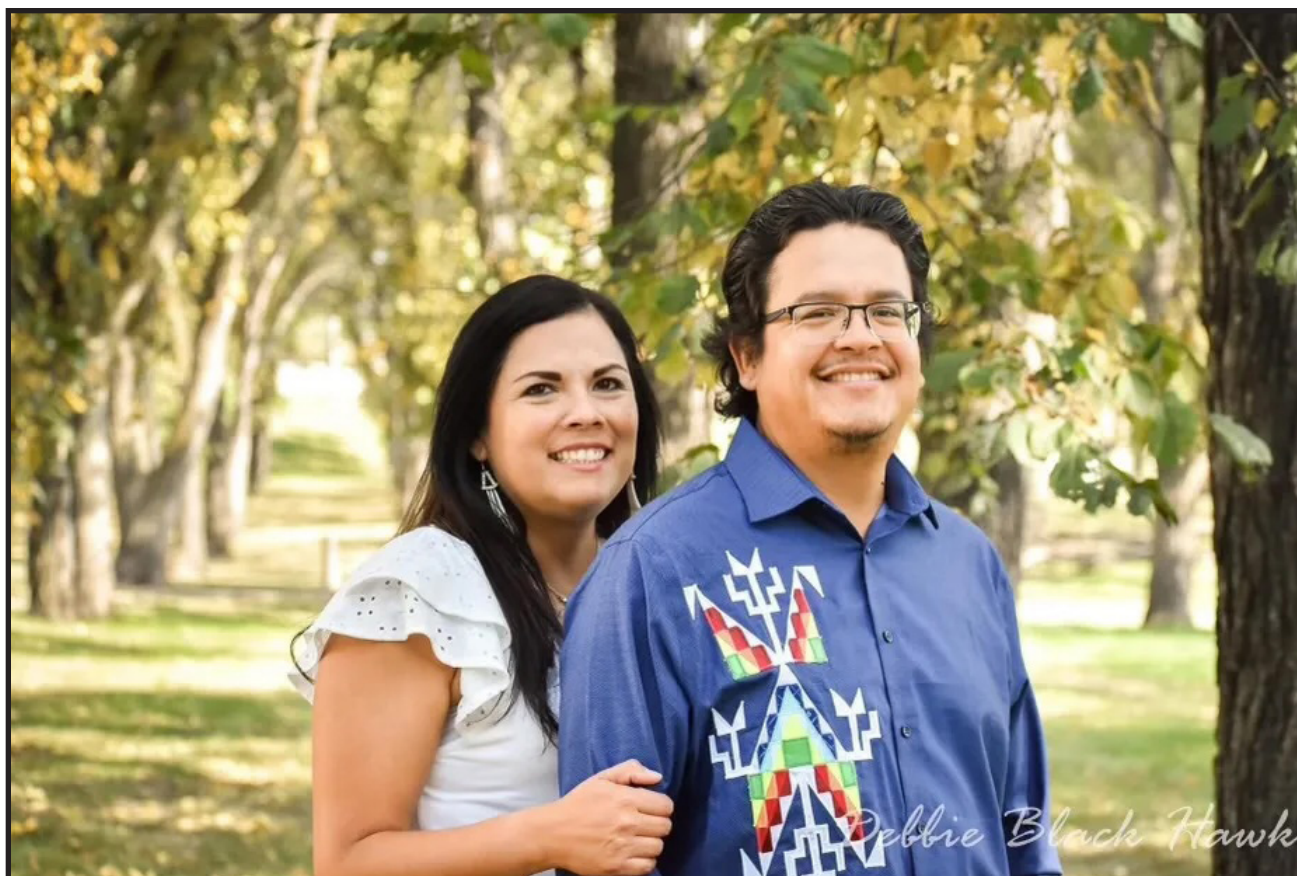
"We want to encourage our youth to embrace their talent, creativity, and individuality while strengthening a healthy well-being and cultural identity," she stated. "I went to school in Dickinson until I was in about fourth grade. The reason why I do what I do is because of what I experienced there. I was the only Native American in school, and I was teased all the time and called derogatory remarks. Being teased like that made me not want to go to school anymore."

But after moving to New Town, Bearstail says everything changed.

"There were people that looked like me there," she explained. "There were teachers that looked like me, sounded like me, laughed like me. We started to learn our language there, and it was a big eye-opener."

Now, she's trying to bring that same sense of belonging to Native American kids throughout the country with the MHA.

As part of this process, ImagiNative publishes a monthly magazine called 'Roots' which highlights the lives and accomplishments of



North Dakota kids.

The publication can be found in many different schools throughout ND and has subscribers throughout the nation.

"They are so talented across the board," Bearstail explained. "whether it's sports or academics. We have a lot of youth doing big things, and we want to use this as a vehicle to showcase them. I hope this magazine makes our native youth feel welcome, and give them confidence and a sense of acceptance. A lot of times, we aren't represented out there like that, and I think that it's very important that they see themselves in all types of media, including magazines, TV, and books."

Even outside of the magazine, Bearstail is ensuring that native youth will be represented in all types of media — by creating such media herself.

Her book, titled 'Bear's Braid', is inspired by her son Thomas, and his struggle with the bullying he faced after growing out his hair.

"It started out with name-calling," Bearstail recalled, "and then it turned physical. We were in the school a lot, and it just wasn't a good time for him."

Bearstail says that Thomas faced the conflict head-on, and has come out even stronger for it.

Now, she's sharing his story so that kids don't have to feel like they're struggling alone.

Bearstail's desire to create a support system for both her son and others in need is something that she admired in another remarkable woman — her grandmother.

"That's something that we all have," she said. "That sense of hospitality. She was always being welcoming, always being inviting, and creating that sense of community, no matter who stopped by."

Despite this idea, Bearstail says many native children may not have that support from elders.

Fortunately, this is something that the 'Roots' Magazine can supply, thanks to a column featuring a local elder.

"A lot of the advice they give is to find out where you come from," Bearstail continued. "To find out what your background is, and to learn about your culture."

With ImagiNative, Bearstail is helping ensure that Native American youth will have inspiration, representation, and connection to their culture, so they can become the future generation of remarkable people.

Bearstail and her husband are keeping busy, with four children and one brand-new grandbaby — but she also says she expects to release another book, 'Finding Cedar', next year.

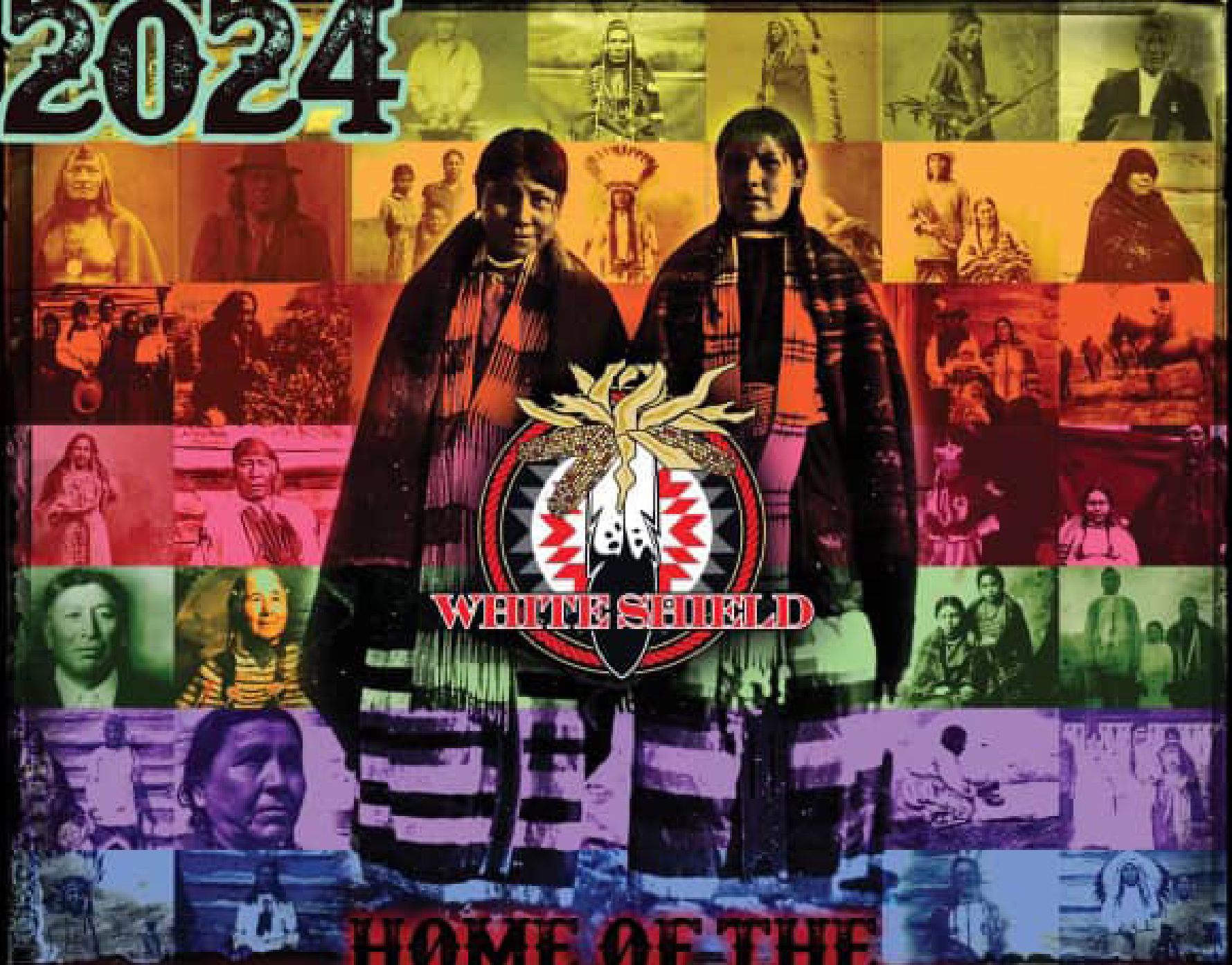

A few years ago, Jill was given an Arickara name, "Around the Fire." Jill was named by Loretta Bear Meredith. A large feast and gathering with many relatives and friends attending.

Education. Jill attended Univ. of North Dakota and other colleges and graduated. She taught English. Later, Jill taught at the White Shield school and other places, and enjoyed her time with students. Jill had the skill to help those who struggled to learn.

Jill and her mother Evadne Baker Gillette were members of local American Legion Auxiliary, Young Hawk, Bear post. When Evadne grew older, Jill was the caretaker for her mother Evadne and took her to events and to visit Hidatsa relatives and others on the Reservation. Evadne passed away in 2003. Jill learned a lot from her mother Evadne and passed on her wisdom and ways to others.

Jill had health problems the last few years, but she still attended many community events and family gatherings. Jill received top medical care from Dr Rising Sun and other medical staff.

Later, Jill lived and worked for the Tribe in the New Town, ND area. She had many friends form all walks of life and visited with friends at the casino. Jill enjoyed reading, poetry, and birding. Jill liked to post beautiful birds on Facebook.

The family thanks all for the condolences and support dealing with the loss of Jill Gillette.

Chance was a very instrumental in helping his mom raise his brothers and sister. The kids adored Chance and looked up to him for everything. He also had a lot of positive male role models in his life, too numerous to name, but you know who you are. One major inspiration in his life was "Grandma Lu", whom he admired and loved so dearly, nobody compared to his "Grandma Lu".

He lived in Brookings, SD and Bismarck, ND but was primarily raised in White Shield, ND. In elementary and high school Chance was at the top of his class. His classmates would get mad at him because he always set the curve high. He was Mrs. Voigts favorite in the Gifted and Talented Program, where he earned various trips nationwide. In addition to academics, he excelled in basketball. He also ran in Nationals AAU in San Antonio, TX and Chicago, IL. His senior year he was selected as one of the top ten basketball players in ND. His team won the Gold Metal Championship in Australia.

When he returned home, he was selected again to play in the Indigenous Games in Canada, where his team took bronze. Chance was the Valedictorian of his class in 2002. That fall he attended BSC in Bismarck for the Engineering Program. He also attended UTTC and studied construction technology to become a master carpenter.

He later moved to Fort Washakie, WY to help his uncle Glenn run the Dakota Seamless Gutters. While living with his uncle he got back into basketball attending numerous tournaments throughout Indian Country with the Denver Warhoopers. Chance was selected as an all-star in many tournaments.

Chance returned to White Shield to walk his mother down the aisle when she married Dallas Dickens who Chance loved very much as a step-father. He was then employed by Fort Berthold Housing as White Shield maintenance. Chance Montel took in his three nephews Cashdyn,

Kingsdyn and Xaidyn and raised them as his own. He then relocated to Fargo, ND with the boys and his mother. He pursued a cooking career at Applebee's where he met the love of his life Leigh Anne Phan. They united in marriage in September 2019. They were blessed with two beautiful Naisans (Native and Asian) Chance's words.

Chance was a many of many talents in addition to basketball, he loved to play pool, cards, softball, and any sport you can think of. Another passion of his was his music Redzone Entertainment. His music led him to perform live in Sioux Falls, SD, Sisseton, SD, and Orlando, FL, Chance was a natural at entertaining. His lyrics were a poetry of his life. He dropped the Mic after he got his children which became his main priority.

Chance Montel Fox II and Chanel Meadow Fox were his world. He was a very proud father and loved his family with all his heart. He was a very protective, loving caring, kind, and proud father. One of his greatest accomplishments was becoming a dad. When his wife wanted to go to work, he chose to be a stay at home father instead of putting them in daycare. Here is where he put his whole heart and soul into caring for his children. He taught them everything from colors, ABC's numbers, days of the week, adding, subtracting, multiplying, even down to square roots. Chance the II is a little genius just like his dad. Chance was so proud of his efforts in raising his kids.

Chance lit up a room like no other with his radiant energy, heart of gold, and love for others. Chance left a mark with anyone he crossed paths with, which includes his in-laws in the Philippines. His family recently visited there for a month renewing their marriage vows. He always said "that was the best time of my life", also skydiving in Fargo.

Chance will be greatly missed. His laughter, his smile, his competitiveness, his protectiveness, and his deep love for his family.

He is survived by his wife; his children; his mother; his siblings; nephews, nieces, and numerous relatives.

He is preceded in death by his father; paternal grandparents; maternal father; and numerous relatives.

Ruebin Clarence Brave Crow was born on September 2, 1985, to Eva and Steven Brave Crow II. He was the youngest son of Eva's children. He left for the Star Nation on Thursday, March 14, 2024, at a Fargo hospital with his children and friend at his side.

Ruebin was born in Bismarck, ND. He is the youngest son of Eva's children. Shortly after he was born, Eva and Steven moved to Minneapolis. Ruebin attended PICA HeadStart in Minneapolis. Where he graduated and went on to attend Four Winds American Indian School. He loved school. Our Ma went to the teacher conference and the teacher said, "Ruebin does well here. He is a bright, smart student. Very curious and a joy to have in our classroom. The only thing is, he is so smart he finishes his work faster than any of the other students. And I told them, when you finish your work, you can play with the toys." She said, "I don't have a problem with him getting done so fast. I'm happy he does. The part I don't like is if the toy he wants is on the tops shelf, he climbs on the bookshelves and helps himself. He could fall and hurt himself. Please talk to him and explain he can't climb on them."

Even before he went to school, his older brother Steven (Corey), would get up at the crack of dawn. Like around 5-6 am and want to go outside to play. So, mom had to get locks for the doors to keep them inside until at least they were awake and keep them at least until about 8 or 9 am. And even then, he was climbing on desks or pulling chairs to the locks trying to figure them out to open the door. Ruebin and Cory were inseparable when they were young. Minneapolis was their playground. They had no fear of anything or anyone. Wandered the city. One time our older brother, Waylyn, came over and asked to get some KFC. Being the two little mischievous boys they were, their little eyes lit up and agree to get their brother and his friend some KFC.

Little did our older brother realize that it was 8 am and KFC was not open until later in the morning. So, Waylyn gave them a 50-dollar bill. There was a cafe, Curly's, who has a couple arcade games in the back. They were gone for a couple hours and finally

Waylyn said “Where they at? They should have been back by now.” That’s when I asked him what he was talking about. And he told me about the KFC and the 50. I started laughing and said, “Shit, they not getting no KFC, they at the arcade.” So, brother Waylyn went to go look for them.

Years later when you asked about this time, they said they knew he was coming so they left and went downtown to the bigger arcade. Needless to say, Waylyn ended up getting his own KFC and the two boys didn’t come back until dark time.

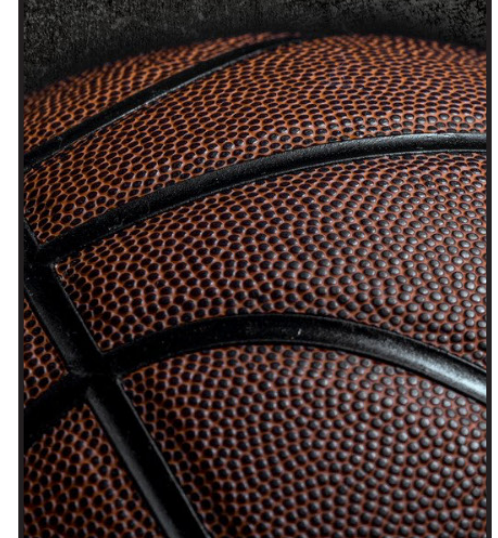
